

Allen Leung Kin-tak



Background

LEUNG Kin Tak, Allen studied architecture in the University of Hong Kong from 1982 to 1987 and obtained his first degree and then his professional degree in 1985 and 1987 respectively.

After graduation, Mr. Leung joined Hackett & Griffiths Architects as an assistance architect for a short period of time and then Rocco Design Partners for three years as an architect and involved in the design and management of several institutional and residential projects. Mr. Leung became a member of the Hong Kong Institute of Architects in 1989 and a Registered Architect in 1990. Leaving Rocco Design Partners, Mr. Leung joined Ng Chun Man & Associates and involved in some large scale oversea hotel design projects.

In 1993, Mr. Leung settled in Architectural Services Department (ArchSD) of the HK Government and involved heavily in public facilities design and management, particularly hospital and healthcare facilities design.

Mr. Leung received his first Annual Award for design excellency for his project-Castle Peak Hospital Redevelopment, Phase 1 in 1996. The same project has received another award for merit in Energy Efficiency Building Design by an external body the year after.

In 1997, another project by Mr. Leung, the Hospital Authority Building and in 2006 the Oncology Building of Princess Margaret Hospital were both awarded with merit in ArchSD Annual Award Competition. Oncology Building was further awarded with the Sustainable Building Design Award in 2007.

Mr. Leung was promoted to senior architect in 2006 and his present posting is senior project manager. His current duty is mainly involved in the procurement of hospital and healthcare facilities through Design and Built method.
